The Light Before Christmas Advent 2023

Our school theme for the Advent season this year is "The Light Before Christmas" taken from a book with that same title by Marty Machowski.

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the deep darkness a light has dawned (Isaiah 9:2)."

The prophet Isaiah foretold of a day when the light of God would pierce the darkness and announce the coming of the Son of God. During this season of Advent, we will go on a journey of discovery to find the true light of Christmas. The journey began long before a star appeared to guide wise men to seek a baby in a manger. It began even before God said "Let there be light." In the manger, we find ourselves delivered from the darkness of sin.

We always look to the light at Christmas time. Lights decorate our homes, our tables, our tress, our streets. Everywhere, we go we are pointed to the light. Even those who are unaware of why we have bright colorful lights everywhere are affected by them. This season, as we decorate our homes with lights and drive around in awe and wonder of the lights that we encounter, let us be mindful of the awe and wonder of the true light at Christmas, the Christ child.

Each Monday of Advent, our school will be having a special prayer service. Our theme for Week 1 is "Light". Students will gather in the gym and learn about how God created both physical light through the billions of stars in all of the galaxies, especially the Sun, as well as spiritual light which is God's truth that shines into the darkness to show us the way to his Son. Just as we cannot live without the light of the Sun, we cannot live without the light of God's Son, Jesus.
