#### Women's Health Clinic Survey

Father Daniel Merz, Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish and St. Thomas Newman Center in Columbia invites all women to complete a Women's Health Clinic Survey. Please read the following from Father Dan:

"Since my time at Newman and before, I have become more and more aware of the need to change the standard of care provided to women. Through talks on the "Genius of the Body" that we have offered regularly here at Newman, I've become concerned with the number of females who express not understanding well the functioning of the female body. And this goes together with the sub standard healthcare they have experienced with a majority of healthcare providers, for example, offering women the quick fix of a pill, a pharmaceutical, contraceptives, in vitro fertilization, etc., which do not respond to the actual problems or issues women are facing. Our Church is pro-woman and we need to significantly support women's health holistically and ethically with healthcare that listens in order to provide for what their needs are and how God designed their bodies.

I'm working with a number of women in Columbia to establish a Women's Health Clinic that will respond to these needs. This is


inspired by the Guiding Star Project (founded by Leah Jacobson, author of "Wholistic Feminism"): <a href="https://guidingstarproject.com/">https://guidingstarproject.com/</a> Such a Clinic will offer essential services such as fertility care, pregnancy care, lactation consultation, pre and post menopausal care, family support, and several other female health services. Imagine a place where females can go during business hours to learn Natural Family Planning (NFP), feel safe, and know the care they receive aligns with their personal health needs on a regular basis. This could be a culture changing service for Columbia and the surrounding area!



### Message from our Bishop

Dear Parishioners of St. Stanislaus Parish,

I wanted to make you aware of a situation in our diocese that may be covered in the media in the coming days.

On July 9, Fr. Ignazio Medina appeared in the federal courthouse in Jefferson City to plead guilty to the crime of interstate transportation of stolen property.

It is our understanding that the charges against Fr. Medina relate to the same incidents our Church has previously investigated, adjudicated and publicly disclosed.

St. Stanislaus Catholic Church is the victim in this case. Following Fr. Medina's plea, the next step will be a sentencing hearing in the coming weeks.

With a goal of continued transparency, the Diocese of Jefferson City is sharing a short statement about this matter, here attached.

As we move forward together, let us pray for a resolution to this matter that leads to greater unity in Christ.

#### STATEMENT

We have learned that Fr. Ignazio Medina, a retired priest of the Diocese of Jefferson City, has pleaded guilty to federal charges on July 9, 2024, relating to interstate transportation of stolen property. The stolen property belonged to St. Stanislaus Catholic Church, where Fr. Medina served as pastor during the years 2012-2021.

Utilizing accounting protocols established by the diocese, the parish discovered funds were missing, reported concerns to the diocese and the diocese notified law enforcement. A full account of the diocesan investigations and church trial regarding Fr. Medina have been previously shared by the diocese and remain publicly available at www.diojeffcity.org.

Fr. Medina remains permanently barred from holding any ecclesiastical office and from hearing confessions. He is also forbidden from celebrating or concelebrating Mass without permission from the Most Reverend W. Shawn McKnight, Bishop of Jefferson City.

Out of respect for the judicial process, neither the parish nor the diocese will offer additional comments at this time.
