#### MO Catholic Conference Statement on Amendment 3

Amendment 3, which will appear on Missouri's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme constitutional amendment that legalizes abortion at any stage of pregnancy with no protections for the preborn child, even when the child is capable of feeling pain. The amendment would effectively repeal long-standing health and safety standards for women. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws prohibiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion.



### Announcement from the Knights of Columbus

We, the Knights of Columbus, are here today to speak for those without a voice... the unborn. I am sure most of you know we will be voting on a Pro-Abortion amendment to the Missouri state constitution in November which will forever change our rights as Missourians. Called, Missouri Right to Reproductive Freedom Amendment (2024), it is nothing more than legalized killing of babies. We would hope and pray I wouldn't have to ask or persuade any of you here to vote to protect the unborn. What we are asking and encouraging you to do is go to your workplace, schools or friends' groups and bring up the subject. Make sure your circle knows how you stand and they know the facts of this proposed amendment.

We do not have the exact wording that will be on the ballot yet, but here are a few key points of this amendment:

- Taxpayer funded abortions
- Abortions for minors without parental consent
- Remove liability and regulations from abortion providers
- Make abortions available up to the point of birth
- Pregnancy Resource Centers must refer abortions

The funding for the support of this amendment is almost 100% from outside Missouri such as the ACLU. The funding opposed to this amendment is 100% from various pro-life groups within Missouri. Why would any Missourian vote for any law proposed and funded entirely by groups outside our state? To combat this evil amendment, the Knights of Columbus has earmarked money from our Meet Life Fund. This money would normally be used to help protect the unborn and help families at-risk. Two years ago, at the KC state convention, we passed a resolution making \$5 per member a council obligation. We have asked all KC councils in the state to contribute their \$5 per member obligation to Meet Life (more if you can) as soon as possible. This vote in November will have life and death consequences. History will judge as to how hard we fight this evil amendment and stand up for the unborn.

Please be alert and vigilant. As more information becomes known, the Knights of Columbus will be here to keep you informed and protect the lives of our most vulnerable.

#### St. Stanislaus Church Parish Council Minutes August 20, 2024

Monsignor David Cox called the meeting to order and led the council with an opening prayer. New council members were welcomed followed by introductions.

**Council Members Present**: Pat Mingucci, Eric Jaegers, Tim Hagenhoff, Betty Kever, Pam Stonner, Emily Mantle, Emily Bailey, Missy Wilbers, and Sue Rackers **Special guest**: Tina Forbis, St. Stanislaus School Principal, and Gary and Dana Wilbers

Minutes: The minutes from May 14, 2024, were approved by all.

**Stewardship Committee:** Gary and Dana Wilbers presented a Stewardship Committee update. The 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Catholic Stewardship Renewal (CSR) will soon begin. Kickoff Sunday will be held on October 5, 2024. The Committee is considering a ministry fair on parish grounds after each mass that weekend.

- Parish survey results will be available at masses on August 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. 186 parishioners completed the survey and approximately 48 pages of comments were received. Comments (unmodified) will be available on the parish website under the stewardship tab. Parishioners are encouraged to review the comments.
- September 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:15 p.m.: A listening session for parishioners will be held relating to stewardship. Members of the Parish Council, School Advisory Board and Finance Council are encouraged to attend (minimum of two representatives from each).
- October 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>: Lay witness to present at each mass.
- October 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>: This marks commitment weekend. Last year 25% of parishioners and 26% of school families submitted their commitment packets. Discussion followed about other ways to encourage submission of packets by parishioners and school families.
- Other areas in which the Stewardship Committee have been engaged or are expanding engagement include deanery meetings, RCIA with other parishes, ministry fairs, incorporating stewardship packets into welcome packets, food for the homebound, youth group, and rollout of a Welcome Committee.

**September 15**<sup>th</sup> **Parish Event "Joy & Jesus":** This is a parish event for socializing and fellowship. It will take place following the 10:30 a.m. mass and will host a variety of activities for adults and for kids. Deacon Mike Brooks (Garth Brooks' brother) will be the speaker. All are invited to attend.

**February 8<sup>th</sup>: "Welcome" Weekend:** This weekend retreat aims to inspire parishioners, build community and transform our parish. This event is brought by Dynamic Catholic. Additional information to come.

#### Parish Facility Updates:

- The parish recently updated the downstairs bathroom in the parish center to allow for better usage of the facility's downstairs area.
- Other items being investigated include sewer drain repairs to eliminate water in the basement of
  the parish center. Two trees on the parish grounds are creating issues and need to be trimmed
  professionally, stumps require grinding, and tree removal is needed. Korte Tree Service and
  Troesser Landscaping submitted bids to perform services. Additional bids to be submitted and
  considered regarding foundation work.
- A request to beautify the island in the parking lot was made and noted. Discussion was held regarding prioritization of projects and ongoing maintenance.

#### St. Stanislaus School News: Tina Forbis reported on school news including:

186 children are enrolled for the 2024-2025 school year and 114 families.

- The self-study brought about a change in the entry for children into the school. It seems to be going well.
- There are two kindergarten classes with 24 total students.

**Rental Policies:** Monsignor requested a review of rental policies for parish facilities such as the gym, pavilion, etc. Discussion followed around calendar tracking, Virtus compliance, legal review of rental policies, and parish needs. In addition to these, it was noted brides currently use classrooms in the school for dressing for weddings. Monsignor suggested using the basement of the rectory for a bride's room and asked the council to consider as a future business item.

Parish Council By-Laws: Council by-laws were distributed to members for awareness.

**Distribution of the Precious Blood:** Parishioners inquired as to when St. Stanislaus will return to distribution of the Precious Blood at communion and reinstatement of the sign of peace. With cold and flu season coming up and a resurgence of COVID in varying forms, this distribution will not begin soon. Monsignor encouraged parishioners to do what they are comfortable with during the mass at the time of "sign of the peace" – shake hands, nod, etc.

**Upcoming Meetings:** The council designated upcoming meetings on Tuesdays at 6:30 p.m. on the following dates: October 15, 2024; January 21, 2025; March 18, 2025; and May 20, 2025. The next normally scheduled meeting is set for Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 p.m.

Monsignor Cox led the council with a closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
