Lenten Faith Step:

Fifth Week of Lent:

THERE ARE FEW PEOPLE THAT WE KNOW BETTER THAN THE MEMBERS OF OUR OWN FAMILY. WE KNOW ONE ANOTHER'S STRENGTHS AND ABILITIES, AND WE ALSO KNOW ONE ANOTHER'S LIMITATIONS AND WEAKNESSES. LIKE THE PHARISEES IN TODAY'S GOSPEL, WE MAY BE TEMPTED TO FOCUS ON THE FAULTS AND SINS THAT FAMILIARITY WITH ONE ANOTHER CAN SOMETIMES REVEAL. AS FAMILY MEMBERS, HOWEVER, WE ALSO HAVE THE ABILITY TO SEE ONE ANOTHER'S FAULTS AND SINS WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THE WHOLE PERSON. WHEN WE CAN KEEP THIS PERSPECTIVE, WE ARE MORE LIKELY TO LOOK UPON ONE ANOTHER WITH COMPASSION. FAMILY LIFE, THEN PRESENTS US THE OPPORTUNITY TO SEE ONE ANOTHER AS GOD SEES US, NOT WITH JUDGMENT AND CONDEMNATION FOR OUR WEAKNESSES AND FAILINGS, BUT WITH MERCY AND COMPASSION. WHEN WE LEARN TO WITHHOLD JUDGMENT FOR THE FAULTS WE KNOW ARE THERE AND SEEK THE BEST IN ONE ANOTHER, WE HELP ONE ANOTHER TO EXPERIENCE THE DEPTHS OF GOD'S COMPASSION, MERCY, AND LOVE. DISCUSS WHAT YOUR FAMILY LIFE WOULD BE LIKE IF YOU ALWAYS FOCUSED ON ONE ANOTHER'S FAULTS. WHAT DID THE PEOPLE WHO FOCUSED ON THE WOMAN'S SIN WANT TO DO? (STONE THE WOMAN). WHAT DOES JESUS SAY TO THE PEOPLE WHO ACCUSED THE WOMAN CAUGHT IN ADULTERY? (THAT THE PERSON WITH NO SIN SHOULD THROW THE FIRST STONE). WE CAN HELP EACH OTHER GROW IN GOD'S LOVE BY REFUSING TO FOCUS ON ONE ANOTHER'S FAULTS AND SINS. WE CAN HELP ONE ANOTHER TO SEE OURSELVES AS GOD SEE US: WITH UNDERSTANDING AND COM-
