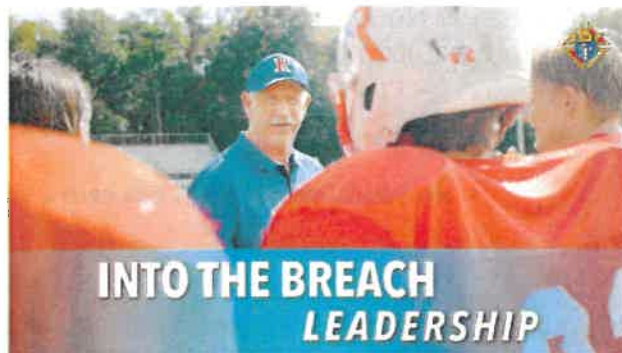

FORMED NOW: POPE SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT



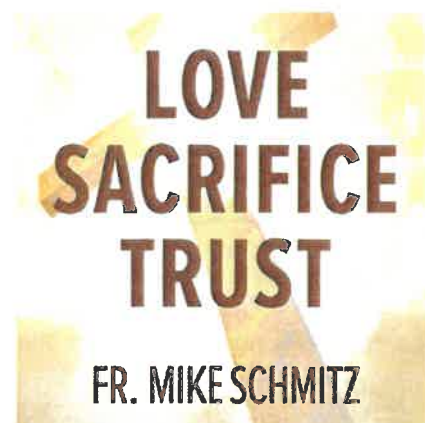
In the history of the Church, there are less than five popes esteemed with the title "the Great."
