## Walk for Life Report 2022

The September 25 Walk for Life was a beautiful, glorious day! Approximately 175 enthusiastic pro-lifers enjoyed food, prizes and interaction with seven pro-life organizations at the Lions Club.

We want to thank Matt and Laura Mertens of Pizza Haus for their abundant generosity, teaming up with the Walk for Life and giving us above and beyond 15% of sales—which included the best pizza around!

We announced the top collectors at the Lions Club on Sunday, the day of the Walk for Life, but WE HAVE ADDITIONAL WINNERS!!! Winner for collecting the most money is Gavin Schaben, who collected \$1232. Liam Long and his sister, Evie each collected \$1000. Mary Kempker was in 3<sup>rd</sup> place with \$950, but a \$50 promised-donation (from a parishioner who was out of town on Sunday) resulted in Mary's \$950 being bumped-up to \$1000, resulting in a 3-way tie for 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Adelina Bruemmer was the next highest with \$575. Two more students collected \$500. These students are John Cassmeyer and Adelyn Beck. The students of St. Stanislaus School and parishioners of St. Stanislaus and St. Margaret's came together to make this a huge success for the mothers and babies! **THANK YOU!!!** We have made our \$10,000 goal (still counting), and an Italian Ice party is scheduled for students, staff and teachers on Nov. 4. An extra recess is also promised! The Awards ceremony will be held at a Friday all-school Mass in the near future.

Those who won the candy guessing game prizes at the Walk include Kylie Riegel, Nash Wilbers, Makenna Perkins, Claire Markway, Adelyn Beck, Cole Wilbers and Gavin Schaben. Poster Contest (3-way tie for Crowd Favorite) winners were Carissa Bruemmer, Kemper-Cole Wilbers and Cooper Bruemmer. Most creative poster was won by Callista Jacquin and Best Pro-life message poster won by Laney Sandbothe.

Mrs. Luebbering's 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class had the highest class participation, and Mrs. Lorang's 7<sup>th</sup> grade class won the most money collected (\$1749.50)! Each student will receive a Life Buck for their efforts. Next year we aim to achieve the 50% goal for Walk attendance and class collecting-- and there will be more prizes given!

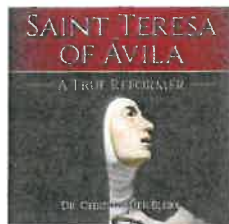
## John XXIII: The Pope of Peace
