ST STANISLAUS CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP

Scheduled for Saturday, April 1st, 2023, at 8:00 am

Cemetery staff will begin cleanup April 1st to prepare for the mowing season which begins April 1st and ends November 1st. It is imperative that all flowers and decorations not in the monument vase and/or attached to the monument be removed by April 1st so as not to interfere with this process. We ask this for the safety and wellbeing of the cemetery grass cutting committee members who volunteer their time in keeping the cemetery grounds looking nice.

The cemetery committee reserves the right to remove any items from the cemetery grounds that becomes unsightly or interferes with the maintenance and upkeep of the cemetery grounds during mowing season. We are asking that shepherd hooks and solar lights must be kept in the vases if they are to remain on the grounds. Shepard hooks and lights that are anywhere in the grass or around the monument grounds after April 1st will be removed. Flower decorations that are out of season, weathered, torn, faded or unsightly flowers even in the vases will be removed by April 1st. All and any type of memory items (crosses, statues, pictures, rocks, etc.,) must be on the base of the monument or in the vase. When weed eating around the monument these items can be hit by rocks or have fallen and broken making it unsafe for the member cutting around the monument. We cannot control what is broken around the monument at the cemetery.

Please keep in mind, the wind can blow flowers out of vases, saddles and around the cemetery grounds, or even be taken by someone or removed with no knowledge of who they belong to. In this case since we do not know who they belong to, we must throw them out. If you do not want anything thrown away from or around the monument, we ask that you remove it before April 1st.

Thank you for assisting us in keeping the cemetery well maintained and looking beautiful.
