Dear Parishioners,

On the day after Easter I will be leaving with about 25 other priests of our Diocese to go to France. In France we will be going to Ars where St. John Vianney served as pastor for over 40 years. We will be making a retreat there and praying in his parish church and rectory. St. John Vianney is the patron saint of parish priests so this is a wonderful opportunity for all of us priests. I will be away for ten days, because there are so many priests away, there are not enough substitutes. On the weekend after Easter, April 15 & 16 we will have the Sunday Celebration in the absence of a priest. Bishop McKnight has given us permission for this to fulfill our Sunday obligation. There will be deacons here to lead these celebrations. So on the weekend of April 15 & 16 there is no Mass at St. Margaret or St. Stanislaus. If you choose to go to Mass elsewhere, all the parishes in Jefferson City, St. Thomas and St. Francis will have their regular scheduled Masses.

Here is a list of parishes in the Diocese that **will not** have Masses on the weekend of April 15 & 16; Brunswick, Salisbury, Wien, Fulton, Mokane, Osage Bend, Wardsville, Bonnots Mill, Loose Creek, Bourbon, Cuba, Steelville, Cham- ois and Morrison. Please pray for a safe trip and a blessed retreat.
