

During this Lenten season, 80 parishioners are participating in a Lenten Small Group Study. The booklet used this Lent is *Grateful Living*, *The Joy of Stewardship*. We would like to encourage everyone in the parish to prayerfully consider the questions below as we consider the area of stewardship during this Lenten reflection.

Week 5

This week's session, which reflects on the unique vocation each of us receives from God, includes this passage:

"Recognizing the things we do well naturally is a way of seeing the grace of God within us; seeing the gifts and talents of the people with whom we interact helps us to know and to value each person as a gift from God. It takes each of us doing what we can to make God's love known, to bear the fruit of God's grace in the world."

What talent, skill, interest, experience, or body of knowledge equips you, in particular, to make God's love known in your part of the world?

Week 6

This week's session, which reflects on the Eucharist as the center of Catholic life, includes this passage:

"The Eucharist is our communal thanksgiving feast. The very word "Eucharist" means "to give thanks." ... In the Eucharist, we follow the example of Jesus who gave thanks to God at the Last Supper, and we are formed as grateful people who are eager to selflessly share Christ's love with others."

In what ways has your day-to-day life reflected the Eucharist you receive on Sunday?
