Those students in Catholic or public schools, or who are home schooled are encouraged to participate. This Years Topic: "Given the Fact that Pope Leo XIV was born and raised in the United States, how do you think that can inspire young men and women in our country to consider the priesthood and religious life?

We ask that essays be submitted no later than January 1, 2026, so they may be judged and winners submitted to the state for judging. Essays must be 350-500 words, a student's original work, reflect the assigned topic and be typed on 8 ½ x 11" paper. All entries become property of Missouri Knights of Columbus and will not be returned. Plaques will be awarded to the top 3 places for each grade level in the state.
